LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Entry fee \$1.00 per class EXCEPT CHAMPIONSHIPS \$2.00.

Children entry fee 50 cents, if the entry is an open or championship class full entry fee will apply.

Children's section prizes will be ribbons and cards only, except entries in open or championship classes.

Prizes in open section 1st \$4.00 & 2nd \$2.00.

“GREEN” bikini vases are available and must be used for staging of flowers except potted plants.

BUD TO FULL BLOOM- is to represent a rose of the same cultivar at four stages of its development and shall consist of four stages.

Stage 1 BUD- To show colour, petals not starting to unfurl, sepals to be disregarded.

Stage 2 Bunch –Midway between 1st and 3rd stage.

Stage 3 Exhibitions-as in an Exhibition Rose.

Stage 4 Full Bloom-Either full or open according to the cultivar.

Stem - Original new growth which carries a single bloom or bud and has received no check from pinching, stopping or pruning from the time of starting into growth to flowering.

Disbudding is not regarded as a check to growth under this definition. The stem should be proportionate in thickness and length to the size of the bloom it supports.

Cut - A cut is a stem that carries more than one bloom and/or bud or buds.

Naming - it is expected that all cultivars will be named.

Omission of name or incorrect naming will not disqualify an exhibit, except where this results in duplication leading to non-conformity to the schedule.

Conditions -this covers freshness, purity of colour, brilliance, substance and freedom from damage, pests and diseases.

A unit shall consist of one vase. An exhibit shall consist of one or more units.

Exhibition Roses are to be shown one per vase, side buds are not permitted, to be shown three deep where possible. Wiring of Exhibition roses is permitted. All classes of 1 to 6 stems and/or cuts, same cultivar, and 4 to 6 stems and/or cuts miniature roses, to be preferably marked with a sticker. It shall be the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that the number of stem and/or cuts at the top of the vases can be counted by the judge and not obscured by the packing material.

Exhibits may not be sprayed after being placed on the show bench nor may they be removed or replaced without permission from the Chief Steward. If an exhibitor leaves a pellet in a unit, the judge shall cause the pellet to be removed and the unit shall then be judged, but two (2) points shall, as a penalty, be deducted from the points of the unit in which the pellet was found. Should more than one pellet or pellets be left in any unit, such unit shall be disqualified. No such unit in which a pellet or pellets are found shall be eligible for a Champion award. Appeals from exhibitors can be lodged free of charge to the chairman of judges within one hour after completion of judging. Where there is more than one stem and/or cut to a vase, they shall be of the same cultivar unless otherwise stated in the schedule. Tied stems in a multi-stemmed unit, the unit will be disqualified. Oasis may be used as a packing material provided that (1) it is provided by the exhibitor at no cost to the society and (2) that it does not protrude above the top of the vases.

DAHLIA SECTION

All dahlias will be staged and judged according to the standards of the Dahlia Society of NSW and ACT Inc.

Size: Decorative, Cactus, Exhibition Cactus and Fimbriated types are designated in five sizes as follows; Giant (260mm & over); Large (210mm & under 260mm) Medium (160mm & under 210mm); Small (120mm & under 160mm).

Miniature (under 120mm); Small Ball type (120 & under 160mm);

Miniature ball type (under 120mm); Pompom (under 50mm); Waterlily, Collerette, Anemone, Orchid, Stellar, and Single type (under 160mm).

All Dahlias under 160mm are to be staged three (3) to a vase unless otherwise stated. All dahlias over 160mm are to be staged one (1) to a vase. A standard unit is a vase of one variety.

Champion awards shall be awarded to standard units. All are to be staged with a combined stem and stalk of 300mm with at least 160mm protruding from the vase. All exhibits should be named.
